CHARITABLE GAMBLING ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES

Oath of Office

City Clerk Heather Slechta recited the Oath of Office with the newly appointed members.

Appoint Officers

It was the consensus of the Board to appoint Rick Caron as Chair and Troy Marquardt as Vice Chair.

Call to Order/ Approve Agenda

The meeting of the Charitable Gambling Advisory Board was called to order by Chairperson Rick Caron at 6:00 pm. Chad Koepke, Faribault Youth Rotary, Mike Donkers, Elks, Ed Little, American Legion, Jason Tobin, Faribault Wrestling, Horace Vigessaa, Moose Lodge, John Rowan, Council Member and Heather Slechta, City Clerk were also in attendance.

Motion by Rowan, seconded by Little to approve the agenda with the removal of Believent Canine Service Partners from the Funding Requests and carried unanimously.

Motion by Tobin, seconded by Rowan to approve the Minutes of the November 19, 2025 Charitable Gambling Meeting and carried unanimously.

Funding Requests

Believent Canine Service Partners – was moved to the next meeting per applicant request.

River Bend Nature Center

Brad Bourne on behalf of the River Bend Nature Center requested \$6,000 to make summer camp accessible for all youth in Faribault and surrounding communities. Funds award through the Charitable Gambling Fund would be used to cover the cost of food for campers in the event the food program with the school is unable to continue to do so this year, provide snacks, cover expenses for camp supplies, extra fees for off-site camp offerings as well as some overhead costs.

Rick Caron asked what River Bend would do without the requested funds, Bourne stated that they would figure it out, the camp would most likely operate in a deficit.

Motion by Koepke, seconded by Vigessa to recommend a donation of \$3,000 to River Bend Nature Center and carried unanimously.

Faribault Art Center dba Paradise Center for the Arts

Julie Fakler on behalf of the Faribault Art Center-Paradise Center for the Arts requested \$2,700 to be used towards costs associated with Mixed Precipitation. Mixed Precipitation

will be performing at a Pickup Truck Opera on September 10. Prior to the performance the Paradise will be hosting a hands-on arts celebration highlighting the arts. Local teaching artists will lead free, interactive activities for children and adults.

Koepke asked how the Paradise Theater raises funds for this, Fakler stated that they ask for donations. Caron asked what would happen without funding from the Gambling Board, Fakler stated they would try to find donations to cover the costs.

Motion by Little, seconded by Tobin to recommend a donation of \$2,700 to Faribault Art Center and carried unanimously.

Heather Slechta, City Clerk, stated that she will bring both recommendations to the next City Council meeting for formal discussion and approval.

2026 Fireworks

Slechta stated that only one RFP was received for the annual Fireworks show from RESPyro.

Motion by Rowan, seconded by Koepke to recommend RESPyro to the City Council as the 2026 Fourth of July Fireworks vendor and carried unanimously.

Finance Report

The Charitable Gambling Board reviewed the monthly finance report.

The next meeting will be held on May 20, 2026.

Adjournment

Motion by Koepke, seconded by Donkers to adjourn the Charitable Gambling Advisory Board meeting and carried unanimously.

Funds will be used to provide a life-changing opportunity for a veteran.

Believet Canine Service Partners is a nonprofit organization that provides highly trained service dogs, free of charge, to veterans with disabilities. Most veterans who receive a Believet service dog are challenged with Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Military Sexual Trauma (MST), and/or physical disabilities.

The need for these services is significant. Within a 250-mile radius of Believet's training facility in Northfield, there are an estimated 21,000 veterans living with PTSD. Even more alarming, an average of two veterans die by suicide every week in Minnesota. Believet is committed to addressing these crises—one veteran and one dog at a time.

In 2025, Believet graduated 12 veteran/canine teams, six of whom live within 65 miles of Faribault, demonstrating the local impact of our work. We are on target to graduate 20 teams in 2026.

The life-changing effect of a Believet service dog is best illustrated through the experiences of our graduates and their families:

- One mother shared that before her son received his Believet dog, she never knew from day to day whether her son would still be alive the next morning.
- One veteran and his wife had not gone out to a restaurant in more than 10 years due to the severity of his PTSD. After receiving his Believet dog, he called the training facility and said, "Guess where we are?" They were out to lunch together—with his service dog by his side.
- One of this year's graduates, who experiences severe social anxiety related to PTSD, spoke at graduation. With tears in his eyes, he shared that he and his Believet dog were able to attend a Minnesota Twins game alongside 33,000 other fans.

The average cost of training a service dog is currently \$42,000. Funds will be used to help cover the overall care and training of the dog, as well as assist the veteran in covering expenses they may incur when completing their required training.

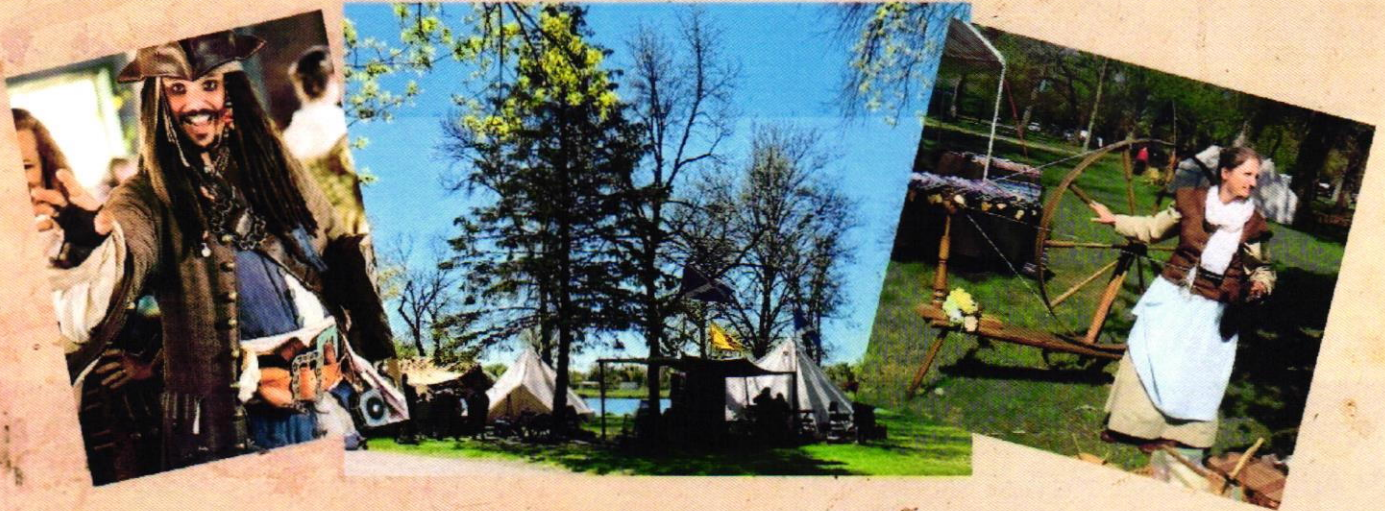
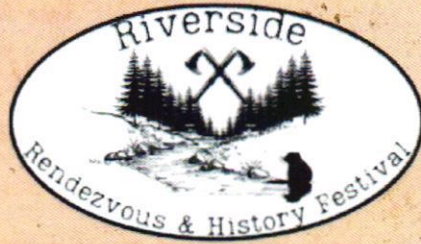

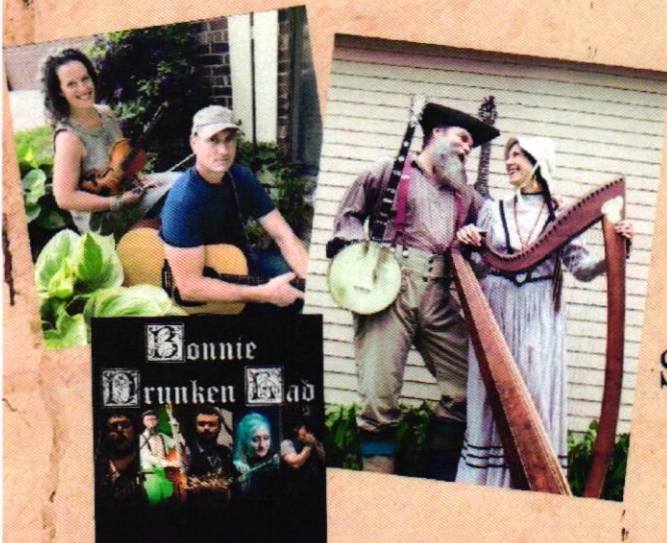

How will funds be used? Funds will be utilized to support Three Rivers Meals on Wheels program in Faribault and Morristown. Meals on Wheels provides a hot, noon-time nutritious meal paired with safety checks that support health and reduce isolation. Demand continues to grow, with an 11% increase in meals since 2023, rising from 19,336 to 21,467. The cost in 2026 to prepare and deliver one meal is \$9.22, which includes food, staff time for home visits, assistance with applications and referrals, volunteer coordination, and administrative support. Based on current projections, we served 5,445 meals in the first quarter of 2026 and anticipate serving approximately 21,780 meals this year. At present, federal funding is only sufficient to cover 10,900 meals, resulting in a significant projected shortfall.

- A14 - For nutritional programs, food shelves, and congregate dining programs for persons age 62 or older or disabled.
- A15 - For community arts organizations, or sponsorship of community arts programs.
- A19 - For humanitarian service, recognizing volunteerism or philanthropy.
